ONEWASH Plus INNOVATIONS

Concept proofing different innovations in the areas of:

- Resilience: integrated models for services in urban and peri-urban areas**
 - Test drilling in Rift Valley: fluoride free results**
- Contracting : “packaging” contracts including capacity building to TWU**
- Private sector: engagement of private operators for service delivery**
 - New curricula for TVETCs**
 - South-to-south Cooperation Programme**
 - Supply chain oriented approach for Sanitation Marketing and MHM**
- Research with Oxford University on water scarcity and equity**

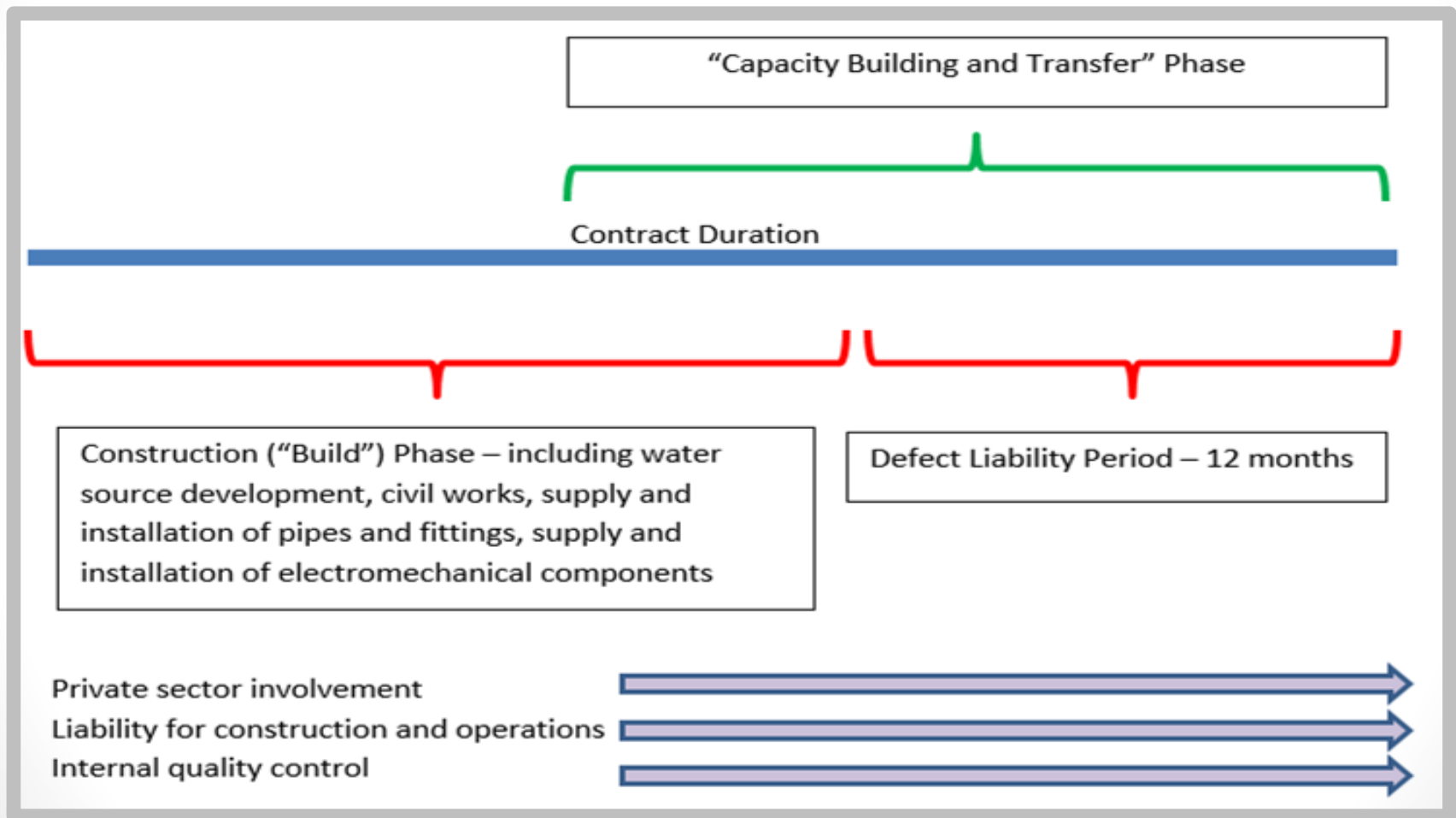
Contracting & private sector for better services:

Build Capacity Building and Transfer

- BCBT (inspired by BOT) innovative contracting arrangement ensuring stronger involvement of PS in post construction + clear line of liability for services (vs individual contracts)
- All construction components + CB are packed into 1 contract (JVs or subcontracting)
- CB (on the job skills *transfer* on key areas of TWU operations) regulated by performance based arrangement with KPI (as per Business Plans for year 1)
- Assets ownership remains with TWUs

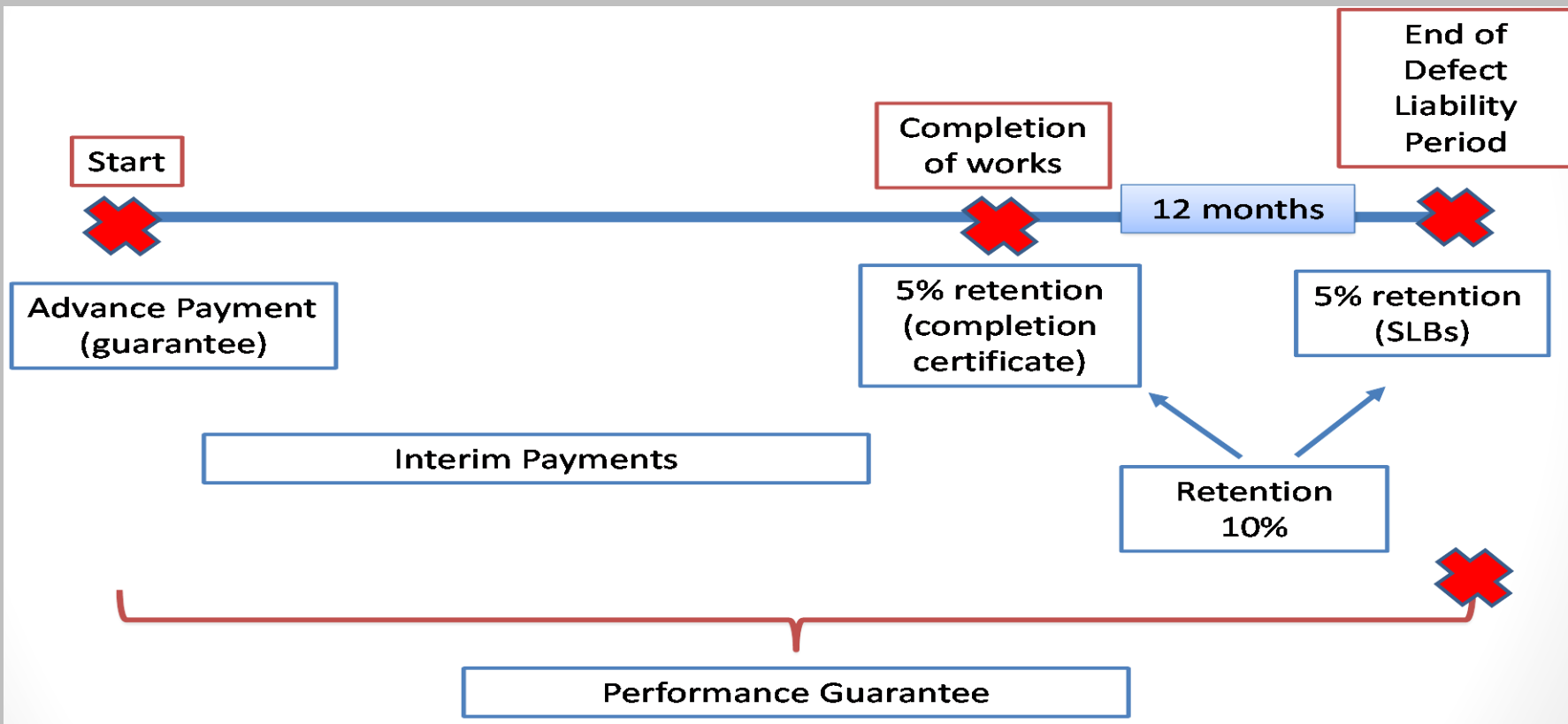

→ BCBT is:

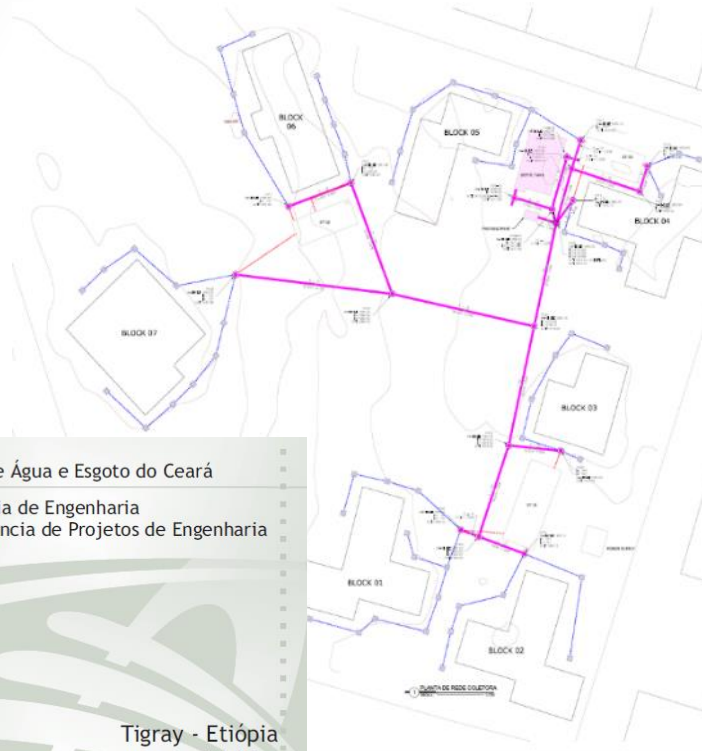

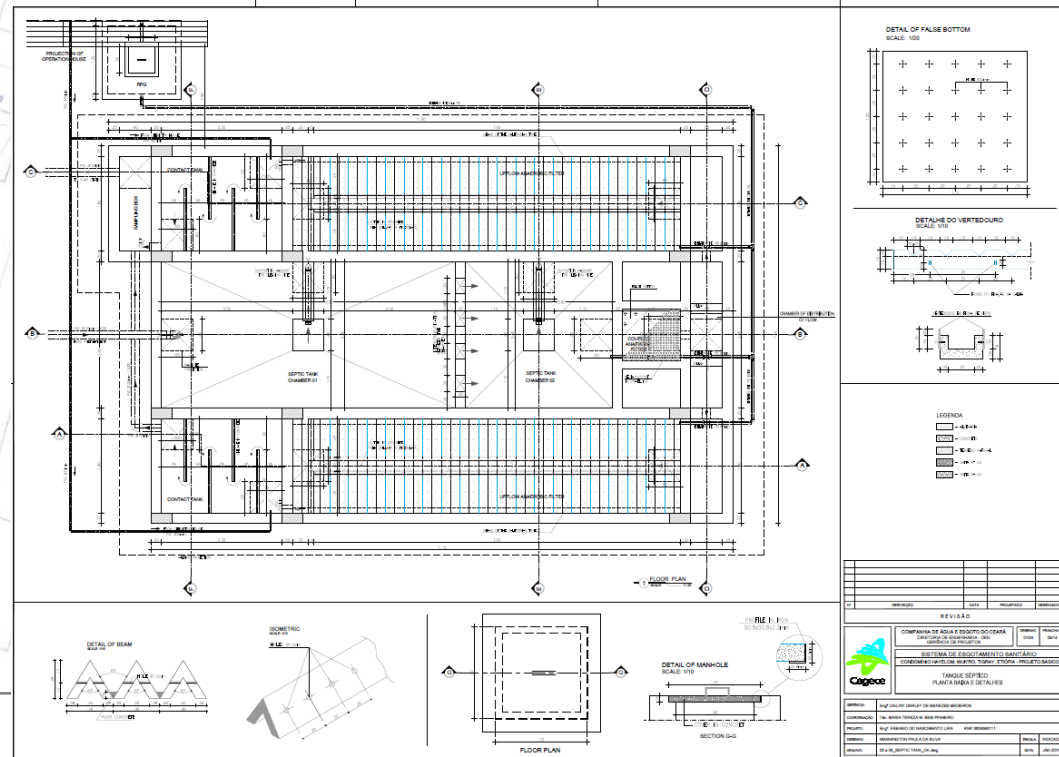

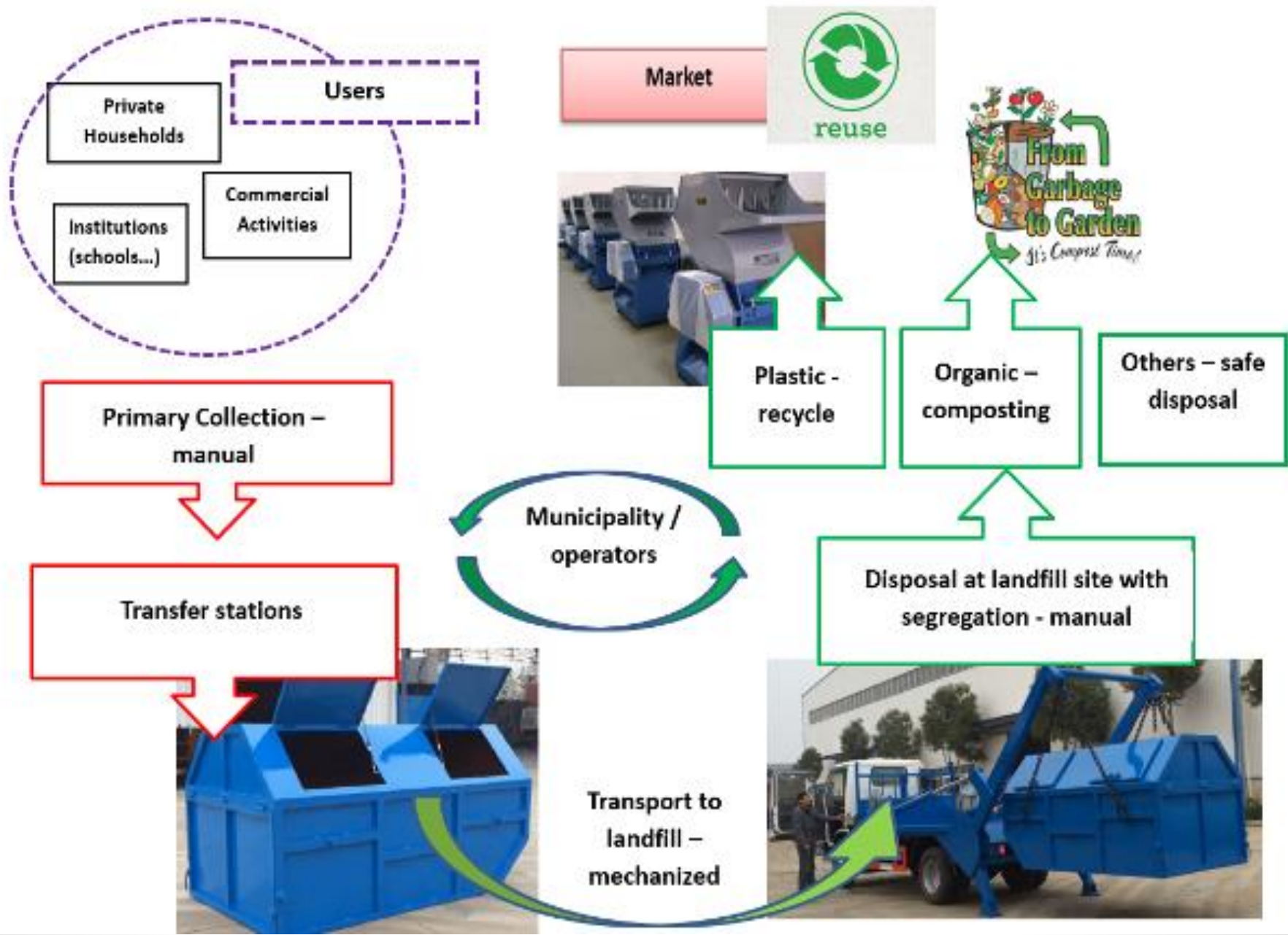
- *An alternative (“zero cost”) option for development programming*

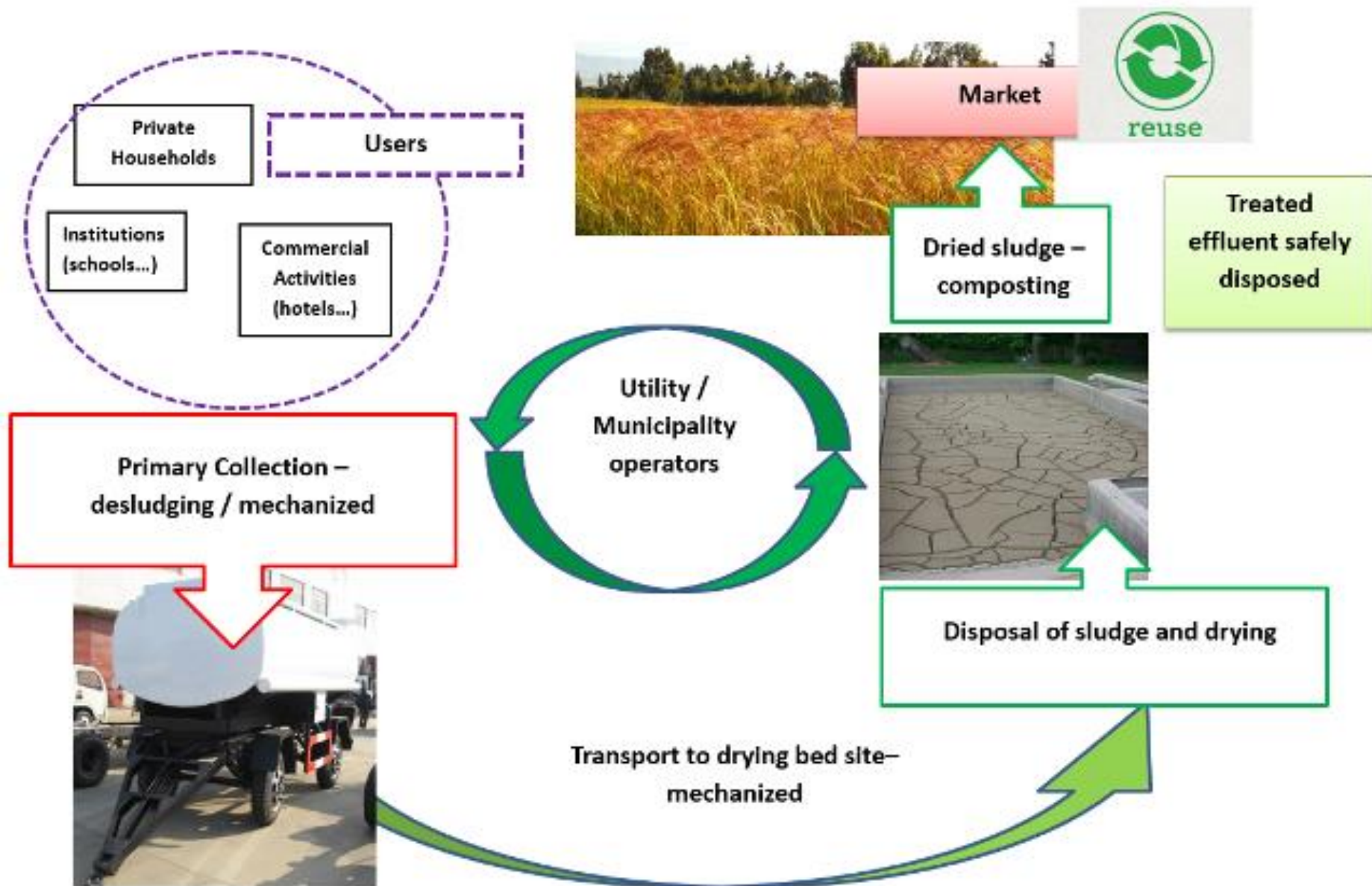
PPOs for Solid and Liquid Waste Mgmt
